Banns of Marriage

The Law requires that Banns of Marriage are published in the parishes where each partner resides as well as in the parish where the marriage is to take place. Identical name and residency details should be provided to all relevant parishes, and where residency qualification is based on either or both partners being on the Church Electoral Roll of a parish other than the one in which they claim residency, this should be made clear at the time of requesting the publication of Banns.

Banns must be published on three Sundays, preferably consecutive, within the three calendar months preceding the date of the marriage. Before the marriage can take place, the incumbent or officiating minister must have received the “Certificate of Banns” from any other parishes involved.

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE COUPLE TO ENSURE THAT BANNS ARE PUBLISHED IN THE CORRECT PARISHES AND THAT CERTIFICATES ARE COLLECTED AND DELIVERED.

Statutory Fees are payable to each of the parishes where Banns are to be published.

CHANGES TO DETAILS

Any changes to the details provided overleaf should be notified to the incumbent as soon as possible and a new form completed if necessary. Failure to do so could have serious consequences regarding the legality of any marriage.
