Brief Testimony of David

David is about 55 years old with dyslexia. Hardly reads and writes. During his childhood, he went to school but would not progress in his studies and teachers did not know what the reasons were. His friends started picking and mocking him. He was put in an assessment centre. He was locked up and abused. Due to bad treatment, he turned violent. He started causing trouble at school and with his mum. Due to an overwhelming situation, He was put under the care of social workers, but unfortunately, the social worker started sexually abusing him.

He sued against him but he has not yet received any compensation. He says I am still waiting for it.

He started to live very notoriously fighting and stealing things. He says, "I was put in prison several times, each time I stayed there over a year. He was also on drugs and running after girls. But now he thanks God that he has found Jesus who has given him freedom from all kinds of evil activities. He loves the Lord very much. He is very regular in the church and bible studies. He loves his three cats and feeds foxes that come in the evening near his home.

Breaking the hard ground



Our Gospel outreach on the street is being continued twice a week. We thank God for friends who joined me in reaching to unreached people. We get to meet so many kinds of People with different faiths. Working in the front line is joyful but sometimes it is challenging as well. Though we meet Muslims every week, on one particular day, I happened to spend quite a bit of time with a Muslim lady who was very



keen to learn about Christianity. She seemed very positive about the gospel. I asked if she could come to the church. She asked me, will there be any other Muslims. I said no. She asked me again, will there be any shops opened that are run by Muslims. I said, no. then I asked her, Why are you asking me this? She told me; "I do not want to be seen by any of my people going to the church, because it would put me in trouble". We thank God that she came to the church and was very happy to spend time with us. She told us that she would come back again.

Gespel Fest, Rochdale

Our church was one of the organisers of the recently held Gospel Fest in Rochdale town centre in August. A total of 7 churches took part, where worship band worshipped, church members shared the gospel and some leaders shared testimonies. Many people in the town were able to hear and receive the gospel tracks and prayed for. We were able to distribute almost 1000 tracks/buckets.



Actually, Towan centre has permitted Christians to hold religious festivals after so many years. The attitude of the officials has been hostile to the Christian events. We thank the Lord that He has broken the hard ground to sow the seed of our loving God. At the end of the fest, I was asked to pray for the town centre.
