Tips and Hints:

- Use recyclable/recycled products where possible; like paper, batteries etc.
- When looking to get rid of something, spend some time looking online where it could be recycled or reused and give it/donate it to that organisation: Search 'Recycling in Ripon' or use one of the organisations listed.
- When needing something look in the local charity shops and those shops which provide eco-friendly services and products first.
- Try reusing and recycling yourself; 'Mend It' by Siân Berry, 'The Sustainable(ish) Living Guide' by Jen Gale and 'Practical Self Sufficiency' by Dick and James Strawbridge to name but a few helpful books.

Facts and Figures:

- Up to 80% of household items can be recycled (Chambers Waste Management).
- Recycling paper uses 70% less energy than producing it from raw materials (Chambers Waste Management).
- UK households generate 7 million tonnes of food waste annually, equivalent to a kilo of food per person on the planet, costing £7.5 billion (Chambers Waste Management).
- Approximately 50% of food waste is still edible and can be repurposed through food banks, charities, or as animal feed and 50% of the food waste we throw away could be composted (Chambers Waste Management).
- Recycling one glass bottle provides enough energy for half an hour of laptop operation (Chambers Waste Management).
- Recycling one plastic bottle yields energy to power a lightbulb for three hours or more (Chambers Waste Management).
- Recycling one aluminium can saves enough energy for 20 hours of TV (Chambers Waste Management).
- The UK discards an estimated 600 million batteries annually, but only 27% are recycled, leading to over 20,000 tonnes of battery waste in landfills (Chambers Waste Management).
- Disposal of 80 million fluorescent tubes annually could recycle up to 4 tonnes of mercury, a valuable natural resource (Chambers Waste Management).
- 25% of our WEEE waste (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment) could be repaired and re-used, according to the Waste and Resources Action Programme (WRAP).
