Celebrating Six Years of Accomplishments in Kajo-Keji (2018 to 2024)

Kajo-Keji Christian College and the Episcopal Diocese of Kajo-Keji gathered on the 17th March to thank Rev. Peter De Groot and Mrs. Jeannette De Groot Van-Driël for their six years of service in the college and the Episcopal Diocese of Kajo-Keji.

The couple heeded the call of God and joined the college in December 2018, embarking on a journey to make a difference. Driven by their unwavering belief that wherever God sends them, they will go, their mission was also inspired by the need to see the South Sudanese refugees in Uganda, a community in dire need of hope and support. The couple's arrival marked the realization of a profound partnership between the Diocese of Kajo-Keji and the Episcopal Church in the Netherlands.

Rev. Peter De Groot, a compassionate pastor, loving neighbour and a wonderful counsellor offered his services mainly in the college. He applied his professionalism by teaching in the college and leading the academic's office. Peter led the team that designed the curricula for Certificate in Theology and Diploma in Theology, Diploma in Business Administration and Diploma in Education for The Episcopal University (TEU) and the college.

Mrs. Jeannette De Groot Van-driël a health champion, worked together with the Diocesan Mothers' Union as a Health Prevention Trainer. She served families in the refugee camps in Moyo/Obongi, Uganda and Kajo-Keji County, South Sudan. Jeannette's trainings focused on promoting good environmental use and conservation, improving children's nutrition and good family planning practices.

"She taught the women how to make use of eggshells to provide iron (mineral) a good nutrient for children", one of the Mothers' Union members praised Mrs Jeanette.

Jeannette's trainings led to good sanitary practices, healthy children and decreased cases of sicknesses in the trained homes. To ensure the sustainability of her remarkable work, Jeannette trained seven women as health trainers. These empowered individuals will be

responsible to impart their knowledge to others within the seven archdeaconries of Kajo-Keji. For a continuous spiritual enrichment of the Mothers' Union members, Mrs. Jeanette prepared engaging Bible Study topics centred on significant female figures in the bible.

Rev. Dr Michael Kiju Paul, the college principal asked Peter and Jeanette to walk with shoulder higher for God has used them mightily and they have accomplished their ministry in Kajo-Keji.

"We will never forget, we shall never forget, what you have done for us here at Kajo-Keji Christian College" he added.

Furthermore, Rt Rev. Dr Lule James Kenyi has appreciated Peter for his aggressiveness in teaching the word of God and also for his positive impact on the lives of people mainly the students who will impact more via preaching.

"You have influenced us and those who received Peter's teaching should go out and impact lives of the many people outside there", concluded the Bishop.

The college and the Diocese will always keep in touch with Peter and Jeannette through social media and physical meetings through missions and outreach.

As Peter and Jeannette go and stay in the Netherlands, may the Almighty God protect them and grant them the knowledge and wisdom to perform the ministry diligently as they did in Kajo-Keji. The editors pray. The college and the diocese are still looking up to the couple and GZB to advocate for new partners to come and build up where Peter and Jeanette had left.



Sustainable Agriculture Project: Guarantee by Friends

Kajo-Keji Christian College, utilizes agriculture as a vital source of food and income. The practice has been a longstanding tradition in the college. The college grows mainly cassava and maize for food. This year's timely field preparation and planting allows better utilization of the early rainfalls.

Apart from food, the college's agricultural activities serve as a valuable learning experience for the students. Moreover, it creates income opportunities for some of the farm labourers and contributing to the local economy.

Pitia Charles Loboso a Certificate in Theology student said. "The money I earn from offering my farm labour, I use it for paying my tuition and also for printing and photocopying handouts".

The college's available piece of land makes the agricultural project possible. However, the limitations of necessary skilled labour and agricultural inputs pose significant setbacks to the project's continuation.

Fortunately, the college's endeavors have received a remarkable boost through the unwavering support of Friends of Kajo-Keji Projects Delivering Hope, a Christian charity committed to fostering long-term self-sustainability among the South Sudanese community. Their generous financial support has

Building Centre of Knowledge, Innovation at Kajo-Keji Christian College



The Kajo-Keji Christian College Computer Laboratory Construction Project has entered its second phase and continues to advance steadily. This essential initiative, launched on 20th December 2023, is a work towards the establishment of the School of ICT within the college. The laboratory will equip the college with the necessary digital tools and knowledge and act as a hub for collaborative research projects within the college and community.

In a collaboration, Kajo-Keji Christian College joint efforts with Co-workers Germany to bring the vision of the computer laboratory to life. While the college provides the essential building materials like bricks, Co-workers Germany extended financial support to cover additional costs. This partnership exemplifies a harmonious union of resources and expertise towards a common goal.

Upon completion, the computer laboratory will also serve as a resource hub within Kajo-Keji, offering various services such as affordable digital literacy classes, access to technology for individuals lacking resources, and an innovation centre. The services will play a pivotal role in bridging the digital divide, enabling individuals to acquire essential skills and contributing to the overall digital preparedness of the county. Furthermore, a new generation of technologically skilled individuals will emerge, ready to serve the community, South Sudan, Africa and globally.

As the project progresses steadily towards completion, gratitude resonates for the opportunities it will unlock and the lives it will transform. The collective efforts of all involved parties are commendable. We navigate through the final stages, our faith remains steadfast. With divine guidance, the computer laboratory at Kajo-Keji Christian College is poised to stand as a beacon of knowledge and innovation, shaping a brighter future for generations to come.

Training for Sustainable Growth

The Episcopal Diocese of Kajo-Keji's Faith, Development and Relief Agency (FADRA) in partnership with Tearfund has trained college students and staff on Church and Community Transformation (CCT).

The training was organized in two phases. Phase one training was for the tutors, it started on the 3rd to 12th of December 2023. Phase two was held in March 2024 comprising all the tutors and students.

The primary objective of the training was to equip the college and students with the essential knowledge and skills necessary to facilitate the discovery of God-given resources within the college and community.

The CCT overviews like envisioning churches and communities, Integral Mission and Foundational Bible Study has enabled the participants to identify their critical needs and develop strategies to effectively utilize available resources to address their problems and attain a human holistic transformation.
