Alba's story: Alba makes beaded jewellery by touch, rather than by sight. It's incredible how she deftly picks up each bead and slides it on to the special blunt-ended needles that we provide for her, and our other two visually impaired artisans Adriana and Sammy (above right). Alba has a daughter who she's proudly able to support through the work that she does for Arizan. Our project leaders Carlos and Jessica visit her at home each fortnight to purchase her work and deliver her materials. Working for Artizan has given her a community of colleagues and friends, as well as a vital way of supporting her family. The commitment that our project leaders show is testament to their dedication to support and encourage all our artisans there, for whom the Artizan family is a lifeline. Our artisans in Peru have been commissioned to make two mosaics for the British Ambassador's official residence in Lima (see the designs above). This is a really important opportunity for them to have their work seen by the Peruvian president, government ministers and many other high-level decision makers in Peru, who are frequent visitors to the property. It puts the talents of disabled people permanently on view for all to see, and will be mounted in pride of place at the entrance. They've also been asked to make commemorative gifts from the Ambassador to all the guests attending the international Hay Literature festival in November, after the success of the sewn bookmarks they made for the event last year. This is another way of not just supporting the artisans through purchasing their work, but also positively transforming attitudes towards them, as guests attend from all over Peru and from overseas too.
