5 Major partners – receiving approximately £2500 per year

CMS – Andy & Kati Walsh in Brazil

Work in Florianapolis Vineyard church, Brazil with a developing prison ministry. We receive good and regular communications, they have visited Holy Trinity twice. We are committed to ongoing support via CMS.

In2Out

“Ticks the box” both as a local charity and a charity involved with youth. Helps Young offenders resettle into the community and their methods have impressive results lowering percentage of re-offending. Send monthly prayer letters and have preached at Trinity twice.

Christians against Poverty (CAP)

An impressive charity providing practical help to those experiencing poverty. Originally our donation was to support a Life Skills course at Holy Trinity. Unfortunately, this did not work out. So do we wish it to continue as a major partner, move to a minor, or remove it from the list?

Diocese of Lake Rukwa, Tanzania

A huge diocese with very limited resources and finances, but a real heart for Jesus, in the midst of rural Tanzania. The previous Bishop, Mathayo, visited HT twice. We wondered whether the relationship would continue with a new bishop, but Bishop Ephraim has proved an excellent and regular communicator.

Artizan International

Working with “differently abled” people in Harrogate, Peru and Ecuador to produce impressive craft products. A personal link with Andy and Susie Hart (the founder), who we first supported many years ago as CMS Mission partners with Neema Crafts Tanzania. Andy and Susie have both spoken at Holy Trinity

9 Minor partners – receiving approximately £500 per year

Wellspring

A Christian counselling and training centre based in Harrogate, who are regularly extending their work to support healing and wholeness. Have sent speakers to HT services twice. Lots of information on their website.

Jennyruth Workshops

A very well known Ripon charity, which we have supported for a long time – and we have a close personal link thro the Evason family. Training adults with learning disabilities in a wide variety of skills, producing quality craft skills which are then sold at many local events.

CPAS

Over the years, Holy Trinity has benefited greatly from the Church Pastoral Aid Society, an Evangelical organisation, both in providing quality training materials, and also thro Venture holidays attended by many of our young people in the past.

Scripture Union

We support the work of Geoff Brown, SU worker in the north of England, in his work promoting Christians materials for work in schools and in training courses.

Kajo-Keji Christian College

Provides course in Theology, Education (teacher training) and business studies in a country where educational provision is very scanty. Close connection through the Rutters who worked there 2017-2018, and also going out in Autumn 2024. Send regular updates.

Salamati

A charity set up by Isaac Lawrence, previous curate, to support children in a very poor area of Pakistan, for schooling, food and clothing. However, communication has largely ceased in the last 2 years.

YMCA Ripon

A charity selected by our young people. Certainly a worthwhile charity BUT it hasn't worked as a charity which engages our young people to get them involved in social action.

Ripon and Rural Driving services

This service which provided useful transport facilities to people (generally elderly) locally requiring lifts to appointments, is now run from Tadcaster, and there are questions about how effective it now is.

Ripon City of Sanctuary

Working with Ripon refugees, mainly Syrian, this cause was supported initially, but is no longer functioning as an organization. In 2023 the £500 was given instead to refugees returning home in South Sudan from camps in Uganda.
