I trust that you had a Happy Holiday, found all the holiday presents you'd wished for under the holiday trees and gathered together with friends and family to sing holiday carols. Now it's back to the exercise programme after too many helpings of holiday pudding and slices of holiday cake.

Before I hear you say that I'm out of my holiday tree and definitely lost my baubles – I've used the paragraph above to illustrate the absurdity of the 'War on Christmas' and the attempts made especially in America to sap Christmas, as we know it, of its religious meaning. In November, Boston lit its Christmas tree after an uproar over an attempt to rename it the "holiday tree". Christians launched petitions and recruited a record 1550 attorneys to fight this substitution of 'holiday' for 'Christmas' and the use of any other inclusive or nonsectarian terms. Their aim was to 'put Christ back into 'Christmas' and combat attempts at political correctness. This past Christmas and Advent season, I thought about all of this quite deeply and although I'm not 'the Grinch who stole Christmas' and love many of the trappings and traditions, I discussed my earnest desire with my family that we consider meaningful ways to re-emphasize the true meaning of Christmas in our celebrations. I want to be like my three year great-nephew at the Crib Service, who expressed the desire over and over again just to see 'Baby Jesus'. The angels, sheep, donkeys and shepherds just didn't feature!

We have about ten months to think about to do this and I would like to encourage others to the same. We need to also guard against the horrors of the 'secularists gone wild' and the political correctness police in their attempts to remove all references to Christmas before this creeps into our country too. Then as we hustle about the shopping malls next Christmas season looking for the perfect gift, we will reflect on the greatest gift of all: our Messiah, born in a manger in humility.
